Audience Engagement Technology through FXP | touch

1. From your smartphone, tablet or laptop, log in to the meeting WiFi network **ASBS** with password **asbs2017** (case-sensitive).
2. Open your web browser and type in the designated URL for your session (this information will be provided at the start of the session).
3. Provide your name and email address to log in.
4. Once the presentation begins, you will see the presenter's slides on your device. Pinch and zoom to get a better look at each slide.
5. Take notes by tapping the  icon. Notes and slides can be emailed to you after the presentation.
6. If your session offers eQ&A, simply tap the  icon to submit your question.

Genomic Assays and Patient Outcomes: Real-world Applications

Want to hear expert perspectives on the analysis of outcomes data and their application in the choice of genomic assays for patients with early-stage breast cancer to enable informed treatment planning? 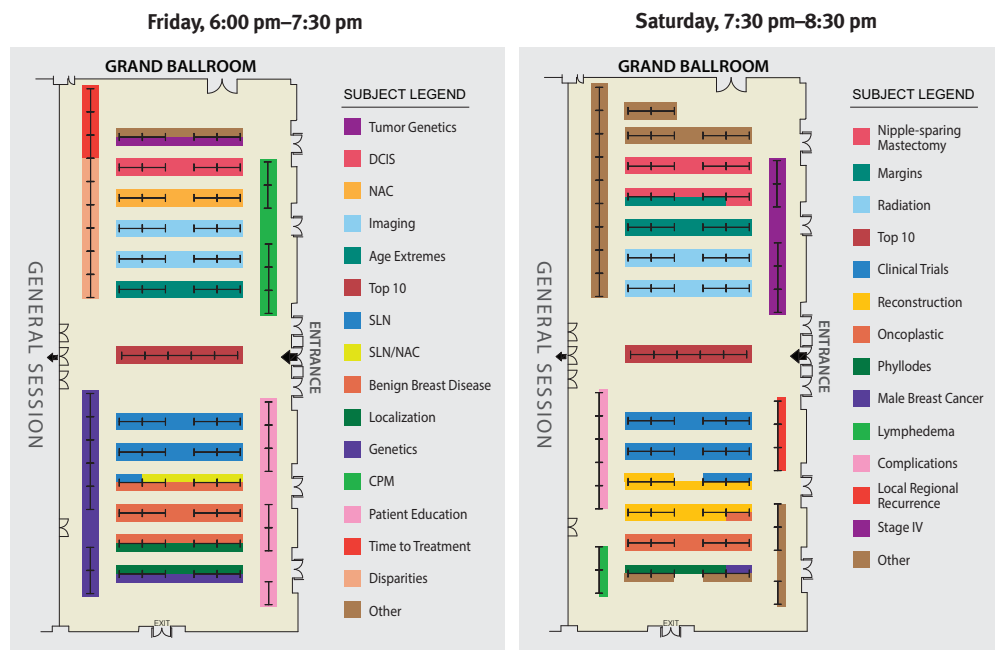

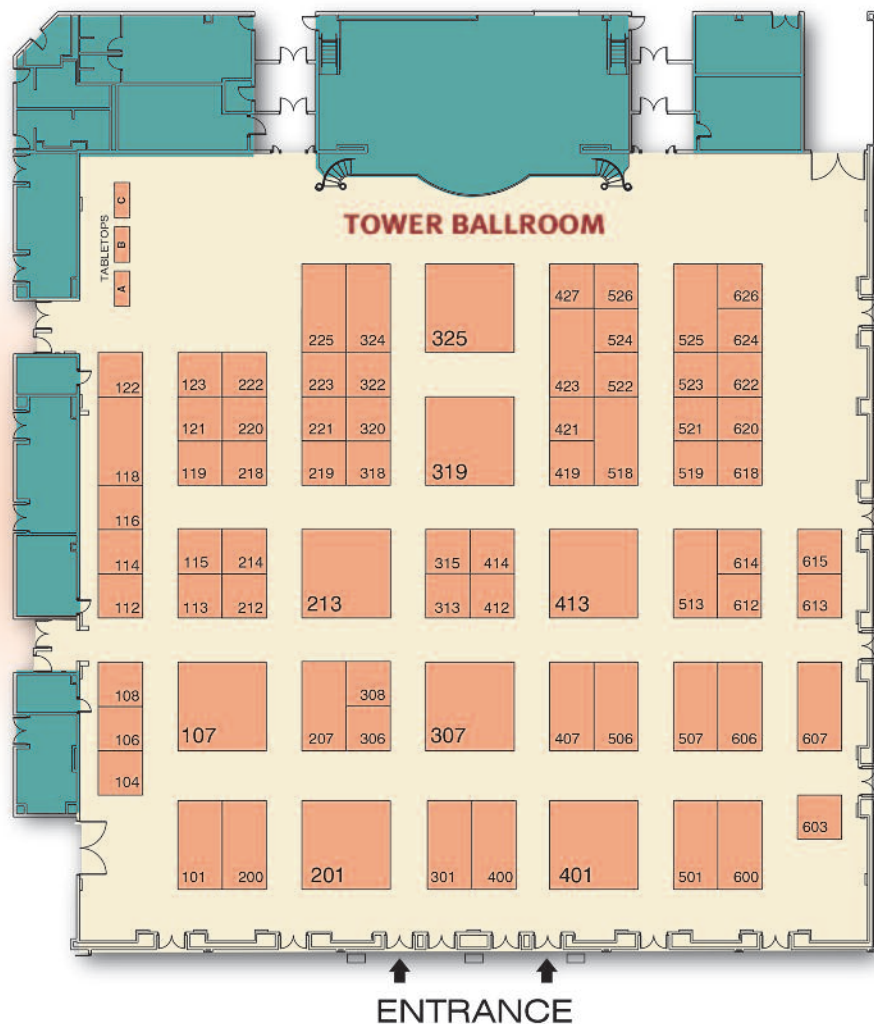
